As this coating thickens, it catches other debris—food scraps, coffee grounds, and paper products. This mixture creates a dense, concrete-like sludge known as "scale." Eventually, the pipe's diameter shrinks so significantly that a sudden influx of water (like during the Friday night dinner rush) causes a catastrophic backup.

Why Mechanical Cleaning Isn't Enough

For decades, the standard response to a clog was the mechanical snake or "rodding." While useful for retrieving solid objects (like a dropped utensil), mechanical snakes are largely ineffective against FOG and scale buildup.

Think of a snake like a drill bit. It punches a hole through the blockage to restore flow, but it leaves the sticky residue on the pipe walls untouched. It is a temporary solution. Because the walls are still sticky and rough, new debris catches immediately. Within weeks, the hole closes up again, and you are back on the phone with the plumber, paying for another service call.

High Pressure Water Jetting operates on a completely different principle. It is the only method that effectively emulsifies grease. The intense water pressure—up to 4,000 PSI—does not just poke a hole; it blasts the pipe walls with a 360-degree cleaning action. This pressure breaks the grease down into microscopic particles that wash harmlessly away into the sewer system. It essentially "resets" your plumbing infrastructure to a like-new condition.
