The Concrete Crack Crisis

One of the first issues homeowners in Bondurant, IA notice with builder-grade patios is cracking. The soil in Polk County is rich in clay. While this is great for agriculture, it is challenging for construction. Clay soil absorbs water and expands significantly. In the winter, this water freezes and heaves the ground upward.

Poured concrete is a rigid material. When the ground beneath it shifts, the concrete has nowhere to go, so it snaps. Within two or three years, that pristine white slab often has an ugly jagged crack running through it. This is why professional hardscapers recommend interlocking pavers.

The Paver Advantage

Interlocking pavers are a "flexible pavement system." They are installed over a deep bed of compacted aggregate and sand. The joints between the pavers allow for minute movement. When the ground in Bondurant, IA freezes and heaves, the pavers move with it and then settle back into place when the ground thaws. They are engineered to survive the Iowa climate without cracking.

Beyond durability, pavers offer unmatched aesthetics. Whether you prefer the rustic look of tumbled cobbles or the sleek lines of large-format slate, there is a style to match the modern farmhouse and craftsman architectures popular in Bondurant's new developments.

Designing for Functionality

When upgrading from a builder-grade slab, the first step is to determine how you want to use the space. A 10x10 square is barely enough room for a table and chairs, let alone a grill.
